Riverstone Timeline

Before the settlement of New South Wales by Europeans, the Blacktown district was inhabited by the Darug Aboriginal people, who are the traditional owners and ongoing custodians of the land. We pay our respect to elders past and present, and acknowledge the Aboriginal people for their custodianship of the land.

Lieutenant-Colonel Maurice Charles O'Connell was granted 2,500 acres (1,010 ha) by Governor Macquarie in this area. He named his grant "Riverston" after his birthplace in Ireland. When the Railway Station was established, an "e" was added to the name.

	John Schofield purchased a 600 acre property known as 'Argown', from Robert Fop.
1846	Sir Maurice Charles O'Connell appointed Acting Governor of NSW until Governor Sir Charles FitzRoy arrived later in 1846
1848	Sir Maurice Charles O'Connell dies, buried in Rookwood Cemetery.
1856	Riverston Estate subdivided into 59 farms and offered for auction.
1863	Work commenced on Blacktown to Richmond railway line, the colony's first branch rail line. English spelling of "Riverstone" came into being.
1864	Commissioner of Railways buys portion of John Schofield's land for construction of railway line to Richmond. First regular train service on the Blacktown-Richmond line.
1867	Greatest flood on record in the Hawkesbury area. Height 19.2m.
1877	Riverstone Post Office established at Riverstone Railway Station.
1878	Riverstone Meat Works established by Benjamin Richards.
1881	Riverstone Estate offered for sale.
1882	St John's Catholic Church in Garfield Rd Riverstone, opened by Archbishop Vaughan on 2 July.
1883	Riverstone Public School opened, with William Langton appointed the first teacher. Main railway station building constructed at Riverstone.
1884	St Andrew's Presbyterian Church opened in Regent St, later moved to Garfield Rd in 1912. Services had been held in the home of Mr John Greig since 1875. Roseberry Park Estate, one of the last subdivisions of the Riverstone Estate.
1885	St Paul's Church of England opened.
1886	Telegraph Office opened at the Riverstone Railway Station.
1892	Police residence completed, now used as Riverstone Police Station. First resident Policeman appointed was Mr E Grace. Vineyards destroyed by phylloxera insect, most small farmers ruined.

2008	John Palmer Public School opens at The Ponds. New precinct plan for Riverstone which will accommodate up to 8,000 new houses, a new town centre, a business park and an upgraded railway station is released by the NSW government.
2009	Riverstone-Schofields Memorial Club won ClubsNSW People's Choice award. Rezoning of land in Riverstone West to allow the establishment of a 16 ha business park.
2010	Riverstone's bicentenary was celebrated the entire year, with the major event being held in May at the Riverstone Festival. Football NSW announces its plans to relocate its headquarters from Glenwood to Riverstone. Riverstone Precinct, one of the First Release Precincts in the North West Priority Growth Area, bounded by Bandon Road to the north, Schofields Road to the south, the Richmond Rail Line to the west and First Ponds Creek and Windsor Road to the east, rezoned for development in May. The 975 hectare site will comprise 9,000 dwellings and a projected population of 27,000.
2011	Riverstone Bicentenary celebrations named Blacktown City's Community Event of 2010. Concern over delay in providing a safe railway crossing continues.
2016	Riverstone Police Station (Quakers Hill LAC) official opening 3 August Troy Grant MP, Deputy Premier of NSW and Minister for Justice and Peace. Population 17,312 (Census Riverstone – Marsden Park)
2019	Rededication of Riverstone War Memorial on 9 November.
2020	Suburb boundaries realigned on 6 November. Areas excluded from Riverstone now form part of the existing suburbs of Vineyard, Schofields, Marsden Park and Rouse Hill, and the new suburbs of Angus, Richards and Grantham Farm.
2021	Population 8,627 (Census)
