### Statement Of Significance

An unusual quality of construction of a building erected for industrial purposes. A rare example of an early 20th century industrial building within Blacktown.

### Criteria a)

#### Historical Significance

The 1954 Substation at Blacktown Road has historical significance as the the key post war building that marked the establishment of Prospect Electricity and the enlarged bulk power supply station to supply an expanding western Sydney region in the post war era.

### Criteria c)

#### Aesthetic/Technical Significance

The building has aesthetic significance in association with 428 Blacktown Road as a later example of the interwar free classical style (early post war) which reflected the styling of the original building.

### Historical Notes or Provenance

Updated

The building at 432 Blacktown Road was built in 1954 when three additional transformers were added to form the power supply into the Blacktown substation. This substation was taken over by Prospect Electricity in 1956, and became the major power supply distribution point to the area.

The Electricity commission of NSW established the Bulk Supply point around the two buildings at 428 and 432 Blacktown Road in 1973.

Prospect Electricity became the power supplier for Western Sydney and the Blue Mountains in the 1950's after the second world war and was a key factor in the development of post war western sydney.
