Significance

Statement Of Significance

66 Crown Street has historic significance as a rare brick remaining example of Victorian residential workers cottage development in Riverstone. The house forms part of the collective village character of Riverstone and is a highly contributing element within the village character.

The cottage is one of a pair of identical cottages at 64 and 66 Crown Street.

Criteria a)**Historical Significance**

66 Crown Street is of historic significance as a remaining workers cottage relating to the late Victorian development of Riverstone as a village servicing the meat works and surrounding rural industries.

Criteria c)**Aesthetic/Technical Significance**

The cottage is of aesthetic significance as a rare expression of a simple brick workers cottage arranged in four rooms around a central chimney. The cottage also has significance as part of a pair with 64 Crown Street.

A small symmetrical brick building with a pyramidal galvanised iron roof. The cottage displays a simple design of four rooms based around a single central chimney which has been removed. A rear kitchen wing has a second chimney. This sort of design is utilitarian but not common in the Victorian era due to the limiting design around the central chimney.

This has also resulted in an asymmetrical frontage which is unique to this sort of simple cottage.

The cottage matches the adjacent cottage at 64 Crown Street, but is the most intact of the two. The central chimney of both cottages has been removed and capped. 66 Crown Street retains the rear kitchen wing and chimney, face brickwork, windows and front doors.
